The Irish Society of the National Capital Region invites your group or organization to participate in The Society's 39th annual St. Patrick's Parade on <u>Saturday, March 16, 2024.</u> The Parade is a major event within our annual *Ottawa Irish Festival*, March 7 – 17, 2024.

As in previous years, the Parade will form up on the Laurier Avenue Bridge, on the north side of Ottawa City Hall, between 8:00 AM and 10:45 AM, and will leave the intersection of Laurier Avenue West and Elgin Street at 11:00 AM. The parade will proceed westward on Laurier Avenue West to Bank Street, then south on Bank Street to Lansdowne Park. "Tear-down" will be at the Aberdeen Pavilion (Cattle Castle).

To assist us in establishing the Parade lineup, it would be much appreciated if your attached application form could be submitted by February 29; <u>deadline for receipt of applications is</u> <u>March 4, 2024.</u>

### PARADE DETAILS

DATE/TIME:	Saturday, March 16, 2024 Starting @ 11:00 AM and finishing by approximately 12:30 PM
PARADE ROUTE:	As in previous years, the Parade will leave the intersection of Elgin St. and Laurier Ave. West at 11:00 am and proceed westward on Laurier Avenue West to Bank Street. At Bank Street the parade will proceed south on Bank Street to Lansdowne Park.
FORMATION:	Parade entries will form-up on Laurier Avenue Bridge between 8:00 AM and 10:45 AM. Each entry will be advised of their position in the Parade no later than March 6.
PARKING:	Paid underground parking is available at Ottawa City Hall, and Lansdowne Park.

#### <u>THE IRISH SOCIETY OF THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION</u> <u>ST. PATRICK'S PARADE – MARCH 16, 2024</u> <u>RULES & GUIDELINES FOR PARTICIPANTS</u>

The following rules and guidelines are designed to produce a safe and enjoyable Parade for all participants and spectators.

1 - All applications for participation in the Parade must be approved by the Parade Manager; all applicants will be advised concerning the status of their application.

2 - All Parade participants must agree to abide by all Parade rules, and follow the directions of the Parade Marshals.

3 - The Parade is designed to celebrate traditional Irish culture, as well as the Irish – Canadian culture of the greater Ottawa/Gatineau area, The Ottawa Valley, Eastern Ontario and Western Quebec; Parade entries are encouraged to reflect this theme.

4 - All participants must ensure the personal safety of all personnel involved with their entry. All floats (flatbeds, trailer, etc.) must have protective guardrails on both sides and at the rear of the float. Also, protective skirts must be installed on both sides of the float. To ensure the safety of both participants and spectators, all entries must have a member of their group walk along both sides of their entry.

#### 5 - All floats must carry a certified fire extinguisher in good – working order.

6 - All entries involving animals must ensure the safety of their personnel, other Parade participants, spectators, as well as their own animals, and other animals involved in the Parade.

#### 7 - Participants or spectators must not mount/dismount moving floats, vehicles, etc.

# 8 -The consumption of alcohol by Parade participants is not allowed before or during the Parade.

9 - No material, including candy, is to be thrown from Parade floats, vehicles, etc.

10 - Sponsor signs and banners should not be a dominant feature of an entry. It is recommended that each entry have two people walk in front of the entry carrying a banner identifying the entry, and the sponsor, if any.

11 - All entries will be assigned numbered cards by the Parade Marshals; cards are to be placed on each entry, at the front left side.

12- Commercial vehicles are permitted only as a secondary component of an entry.
