It's time for the citizens of Ottawa to celebrates all things Irish on Saturday March 7th at 12 Noon as the Irish Society takes back the streets of Ottawa to celebrate the Bicentennial of Bytown and the start of the construction of the Rideau Canal.

The return of the 39th St Patrick's Parade starting off from the Supreme Court of Canada buildings on 301 Wellington Street marching east to Sussex Drive before turning North to York Street to finally resting in the Heart of the Byward Market.

We are asking everyone who is a descendant of a Canal Worker to join us and register to march in the St Patrick's Parade so we can make this a component of the annual event. We are hoping that by 2032 to have 1000+ Canal Workers marching to mark the Bicentennial of the completion of the Rideau Canal.

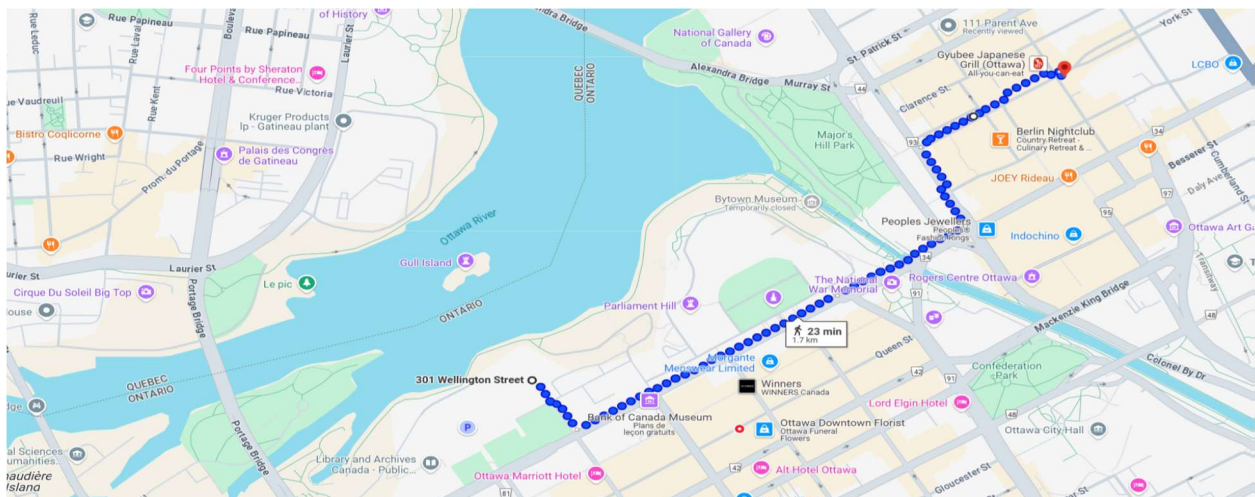

St. Brigid's Day

Ireland celebrates St. Brigid's Day (Lá Fhéile Bríde) to acknowledge St. Brigid, and to commemorate the Celtic festival of Imbolc. It has been an official public holiday in Ireland since 2023. It is the celebration of spring, fertility, and protection that can be traced back to the 5th century saint as well as to a Celtic goddess with the same name. As Ireland's only female patron saint, the day is dedicated to showcasing women's creativity, strength, and heritage. In the past, Lá Fhéile Bríde was one of Ireland's most significant holidays.

Many of the old customs have been abandoned in modern times, however Lá Fhéile Bríde has recently gained some much-needed attention and revitalization. In Ireland, many people still celebrate St. Brigid's Day as the first day of spring.

Even though it's still rather cold, daffodils flowering, fresh buds on trees, snowdrops blooming, and a slight change in the light all signal the arrival of spring in Ireland. It was a time to look forward to brighter days, warmer weather, new growth on the land and the birth of farm animals.

On January 31st, the eve of St. Brigid's Day, one of the women in the household would call to the front door in many Irish households. She would knock with fresh green reeds in her arm, symbolizing Brigid and spring.

The family waiting inside would open the door to welcome Brigid and spring. Candles were lit outside of many rural homes to honour the saint, bring good fortune, and illuminate her path. On the eve of St. Brigid, it was thought that Brigid visited the area and bestowed blessings on houses that had her cross or lit candles.

In preparation for St. Brigid's Day, rushes are gathered and weaved into crosses. They represent protection, health, and new life, warding off evil, fire, and hunger from homes and livestock, celebrating the coming of spring (Imbolc). The weaving follows the path of the sun, moving from left to right.

Irish Fish Cakes

Prep Time: 15 minutes

Cook Time: 20 Minutes

Servings: 6 servings



Ingredients

454 g russet potatoes

454 g cod fillet

15 g spicy ketchup or chili sauce a handful of minced fresh parsley

juice of 1/2 lemon

2 large eggs, beaten

2.5 g each salt and fresh ground black pepper

96 g Ritz crackers, finely crushed (use a small food processor or a rolling)

vegetable oil for frying

Garnish

sliced green onion

chopped parsley

Instructions

- Peel and chop the potatoes into large chunks. Put them in a saucepan, cover with cold water, add 2 teaspoons of salt, and bring to a boil. Cook until the potatoes are very soft.
- Put the cod in a shallow saute pan and cover with cold water. Bring to a boil, and then cover, turn off the heat, and let the fish poach for about 10-15 minutes. Drain.
- Drain the potatoes and put them into a large mixing bowl. Use the back of a fork to
- mash them, leaving a little bit of texture.
- Add the ketchup, parsley, lemon juice, beaten eggs, and salt and pepper. Stir briefly to combine, and then add the fish, breaking it apart with your fingers as you add it. (Check
- for tiny bones as you do this.) Fold the fish into the mixture until everything is evenly
- incorporated. It will be fairly wet.

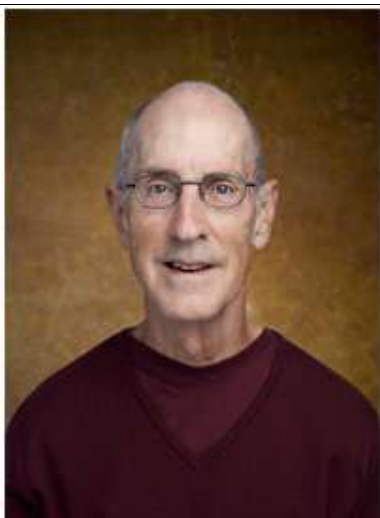

- I use a 75-80 g measure to scoop out the mixture and form into patties. Flour your hands if necessary.
- Roll each patty in the Ritz cracker crumbs, to coat all surfaces and set on a platter. You can cover and refrigerate the cakes at this point for later cooking if you like.
- Coat the bottom of a skillet (I like cast iron) with vegetable oil and heat on medium heat until hot. Fry the cakes for about 5 minutes on each side until golden, crispy, and hot throughout. Note: the cakes will be very delicate, move and flip them with extra care.

David Mulholland - ISNCR 2026 Choice

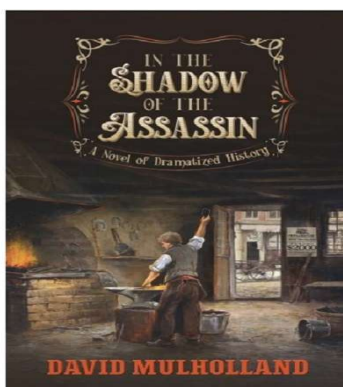

Born in 1940 in Kingston, Ontario, Canada and Raised in the Ottawa Valley town of Arnprior. He's lived in Ottawa since 1970.

Mulholland began his writing career as an advertising copywriter in private radio. He went on to work as a researcher, story editor and interviewer for CBC Public Affairs television, a general-assignment reporter and music reviewer for The Ottawa Citizen, a syndicated country-music columnist, a part-time stand-up comic with Yuk Yuks, and a speech writer for a number of departments in the federal government.

During those years, Mulholland wrote fiction when time permitted. In the spring of 2001, he began devoting full-time to writing a novel. The result is McNab, which was published in October 2006. DUEL, his second 'novel of dramatized history,' was published in October 2009. Chaudière Falls (2016) is his third, and In the Shadow of the Assassin his fourth. He's now working on short stories loosely based upon characters in the Ottawa Valley.
